We are next to St Cuthmans Church. Entrance to Centre from St Cuthmans Close. Group and Club Facilities based Ground Floor Function Room. Community & Admin Offices, First Floor Room 7a. A lift to 1st floor is available for disabled visitors.

Buses - The 1 & 1A & 21 & 21A buses travel through Brighton City Centre, into Whitehawk on a regular basis. The bus stops outside Valley Social Centre. Approx 20 minutes from City Centre.

By Car – Access into Brighton via A23/A27/A259 depending on direction you travel. Valley Social Centre have a car park (first come first served basis) but there is plenty of free on street parking available.

Train – No direct train service available. Plenty of buses running from Brighton Station to Western Road/North Street to change onto a Number 1 or 1A or 21 or 21A towards Whitehawk.

Parking at the Centre

There is parking at the Valley Social Centre on a first come first served basis as other people use the building but plenty of **free** on street parking. Parking accessed via St Cuthmans Close, please park carefully and do not block access into gated car park or park over residents driveways.

Disabled parking-

Brighton and Hove City Council's rules state that (providing you display a badge) you can:

- Park on a single or double yellow line for up to three hours.
- Park in Pay & Display areas for an unlimited period but not permit parking.
